A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKE OSWEGO
DECLARING A BALLOT TITLE FOR CHARTER AMENDMENT ON SPRING-
BROOK PARK PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

WHEREAS a petition has been filed under the initiative
powers to place on the ballot at the 7 November 1978
election a charter amendment to preserve Springbrook Park
as a natural area; and

WHEREAS, the City Recorder has certified that an adequate
number of valid signatures of electors qualified to vote on
this proposition have signed the petition; and

WHEREAS the City Attorney has proposed a ballot title for
the initiative measure; and

WHEREAS Julia Ferreira, one of the chief petitioners, has
objected to the ballot title proposed by the City Attorney;
and

WHEREAS the City Council has considered the proposed ballot
title submitted by the City Attorney and Julia Ferreira,
heard argument, and considered the requirements of ORS
254.070; it is

RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lake Oswego to
place on the ballot in the election to be held 7 November
1978 the ballot title attached hereto and designated as
exhibit "C" (as amended).

Read by title only and adopted at the regular meeting of
the City Council held on the 5th day of September 1978.





59 CHARTER AMENDMENT TO PRESERVE SPRINGBROOK
PARK AS A NATURAL AREA

PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION: Shall the City Charter be amended for the purpose of preserving Springbrook Park as a natural area? Limits development in Springbrook Park to picnic and sanitary facilities, trails for hiking, jogging, horseback, and bicycle riding. Prohibits construction of any athletic facility, parking lot, road, or trail for motorized vehicles within Springbrook Park. Applies to any future park acquired by bond issue if voters specifically designate.
