17	Intervenor seeks relief under ORS 227.19	77 and argues that the City of Lake Oswego
18	violated Chapter X of its charter when approving the Plaintiff's project. As basis for relief	
19	pursuant to ORS 227.197(5), Intervenor must show that the City of Lake Oswego violated, "a	
20	substantive provision of the local comprehensive plan or land use regulations as those terms ar	
21	defined in ORS 197.015[.]" Violation of something other than the two items explicitly	
22	delineated in ORS 227.197(5) is not a legal basis for Intervenor's desired relief. Intervenor	
23	concedes that Chapter X is not a part of the Lake Oswego Comprehensive Plan (he also fails to	
24	present any evidence as to the contrary), but rather argues that it is a land use regulation.	
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1	ORS 197.015(11) defines the following four items as land use regulations,	
2	1) any local government zoning ordinance,	
3	2) land division ordinance adopted under ORS 92.044 (Adoption of standards and procedures governing approval of plats and plans),	
5	3) land division ordinance adopted under 92.046 (Adoption of regulations governing approval of partitioning of land), or	
6 7	4) similar general ordinance establishing standards for implementing a comprehensive plan.	
8	Intervenor concedes that Chapter X is not a land division ordinance (he also fails to	
9	present any evidence as to the contrary). As such, Intervenor must argue that Chapter X is either	
10	a "local government zoning ordinance" or a "general ordinance establishing standards for	
11	implementing a comprehensive plan." Chapter X is plainly neither.	
12	Chapter X is a voter initiative that was not implemented with the formalities that are	
13	required for adoption of an ordinance.	
14	Pursuant to Chapter VIII of the Lake Oswego Charter, only the City Council may adopt	
15	ordinances. In order to adopt an ordinance, the City must proceed as follows pursuant to Lake	
16	Oswego Charter VIII, Section 33:	
17	A. Filing: A proposed ordinance shall be filed with the City Recorder at least one week prior to the Council meeting at which it will be considered.	
18 19	B. Notice: Written notice of the ordinance shall be posted at City Hall and two other public places and published in a newspaper of general circulation in the	
20	City at least one week prior to the meeting at which the proposed ordinance will be considered. The notice shall include the title of the proposed ordinance and the	
21	date, time and place of the council meeting and shall state that copies of the ordinance are available in the City Recorder's Office.	
22	C. Consideration and Enactment: Except as provided in this subsection, a	
23	proposed ordinance may be considered and enacted at single meeting of the Council. If the Council substantially amends the ordinance as presented, enactment shall be continued to a second meeting of the Council to enable	
24	preparation and presentation of an amended ordinance. For the purposes of this section, a "substantial amendment" is an amendment that modifies the substantive	
25	effect of the ordinance. Correction of typographical errors, procedural modifications and wording or format changes that clarify meaning shall not be	
26	considered substantial amendments.	

1	As argued in New Look Development, LLC's Response to Motion to Intervene, once an	
2	ordinance is brought through this process, it is then "enacted upon approval of a question by a	
3	vote by the City Council." Lake Oswego Charter VIII, Section 35. (Emphasis added.)	
4	Chapter X was not filed with the City Recorder one week prior to considering it. The	
5	City Council did not provide the required written notice for Chapter X prior to considering it.	
6	The City Council did not deliberate on the merits, nor did it enact Chapter X. Indeed, the City	
7	did not take any of the steps necessary to adopt Chapter X as an ordinance pursuant to the Lake	
8	Oswego City Charter. Therefore, Chapter X is not an ordinance, and as such, it does not provide	
9	any legal grounds for granting Intervenor's desired relief.	
10	Because Chapter X is not an ordinance, Intervenor cannot demonstrate that the City of	
11	Lake Oswego violated "a substantive provision of the local comprehensive plan or land use	
12	regulations as those terms are defined in ORS 197.015" when approving Plaintiff's project.	
13	Accordingly, Intervenor's challenge to mandamus relief must be denied.
